

Allison Park Group, Inc Conflict Materials, RoHS & REACH Statement

Conflict Materials Compliance

On August 22, 2012, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) issued the final conflict minerals rule under Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the “Conflict Minerals Rule”). The Conflict Minerals Rule requires publicly traded companies to report annually the presence of “Conflict Minerals” (tin, tungsten, tantalum and gold, or “3TG”) originating in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries (Covered Countries).

All current enclosures and mounts are manufactured to comply with the underlying SEC rules and regulations surrounding Conflict Minerals.

RoHS Compliance

In February 2003, the European Union (EU) released a directive regarding the Restriction of Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Equipment (RoHS). The directive restricts the use of lead and other materials in electronic equipment sold in the EU beginning July 1, 2006.

APG supports protecting the environment and serving our customers effectively. We have many customers who need to meet the requirements of RoHS, and we are committed to helping them.

APG does not perform RoHS testing in house at this time but relies on response from suppliers for validation and compliancy information.

All current enclosures and mounts are manufactured to meet the RoHS directive and are compliant.

REACH Compliance

In June 2007, the European Union Regulation (EC) 1907/2006 concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH) was first released. This Regulation establishes specific duties and obligations for companies in the European Union (EU) that manufacture or import substances on their own, in preparations, or in articles.

- Under the structure of the REACH Regulation, APG is a manufacturer and supplier of “articles” to our EU customers through several APG distributors located within the EU. We do not manufacture or supply “substances” or “preparations” and our articles do not involve the “intentional release of substances”. Accordingly, we foresee no registration or pre-registration requirement for the products we supply.

- APG is constantly monitoring the substances of very high concern (SVHCs), as defined by REACH, in our products. This will be an on-going process since the complete list of SVHCs will be released in stages.
- The customers are encouraged to visit the following site to get the most up to date information on current list of SVHCs under REACH:

- APG products (articles) do not contain Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) above the threshold value declared as per ECHA till 15-June-2015 with 163 SVHC.
